Christmas and People Stories from the Midwest Food Bank

FYI, our Kitchen Committee receives food free-of-charge from the Midwest Food Bank and uses it to prepare the Agape Table meal offered the second Wednesday of each month at 5:30 PM in the social hall, also free-of-charge to anyone who wants to join us. The following article is from their newsletter.

"Through last week, 207 truckloads of food valued at \$18 million have come into our MFB Pennsylvania warehouse in 2023, primarily through our "food rescue" activities. Rather than going to a landfill, that food was/is being distributed free of charge to 200+ nonprofit partners who are helping feed over 208,000 people in need. We emphasize the "free of charge" because, frankly, we hear about our agencies paying higher fees at other food banks while those agencies are also seeing record levels of people in need.

Because we have been blessed by the efforts of almost 900 volunteers, MFB Pennsylvania can share our blessings with our partners free of charge so they can help more people. We work hard to make that happen and pledge to continue doing that! Between December 22 and January 1, our warehouse will be closed to the public for end-of-year inventory and some time off for staff. In the new year, we will share our official report of how much food, how many trucks, etc. While the numbers are fun to share, the real story of Midwest Food Bank Pennsylvania is a story of people. The people who donate their time, talents, and treasures. The people who are fed (physically and spiritually). The people who feed the people who need to be fed.

Of course, the Christmas story is about people, too. A baby. A mom and a dad. Unlikely party guests (shepherds) and fancy party guests (magi). God loves people. By His incredible and amazing grace, He uses and chooses people – then, now; at Midwest Food Bank Pennsylvania and around the world!

From our MFB Pennsylvania family to you and your family, we wish you a Merry Christmas and a blessed, healthy New Year. We'll see you at the warehouse for the 2024 chapter of our story!

<u>Community Aid Bins</u>: The two Community Aid bins at the east end of the parking lot are waiting for donations. Trinity receives 3 cents per pound back for whatever is donated which in turn is used to support Trinity's Mission Outreach. The items we donate support Community Aid's mission.

<u>Newsletter Distribution</u>: Please call the church office at 570-682-9373 if you would like to receive the newsletter via email or U.S. mail or if you would prefer a LARGE PRINT version. You may also pick up a copy inside the office entrance or on the shelving unit to the right of the glass case across from the Nursery classroom.

<u>Birthdays and Anniversaries</u>: To help celebrate birthdays and wedding anniversaries, we would like to project pictures on the screen at the time of singing. Anyone interested should submit a photo two weeks ahead of the date. Just put it in the door of the church office. Surprise your loved one with a photo from the past! We can also include in the newsletter. Just let us know.

<u>Communion Cards</u>: Please make sure that you sign a Communion Card. Record of Communion keeps you in active member status. Pencils in the pews will be disinfected. After you use a pencil, leave it on the pew or place it in a container on the way out of worship so it can be disinfected.

<u>Tree of Life</u>: Leaves in honor or memory of loved ones or special events such as weddings, confirmations, baptisms are still available. The cost is \$60 per leaf with proceeds designated for Christian Education. If interested, please complete a Leave Your Legacy form for each leaf. These forms can be found on the glass case across from the Nursery Classroom and returned to Vernon Schlegel.
